55.92% voter turnout in T. Nagar

Polling for the Assemble election passed off peacefully in T. Nagar constituency on April 6.

There was a brisk turnout in the morning and evening though the overall voter turnout was only 55.92% as against the city average of 59.06%.

Many first-time voters as well as senior citizens said that they voted without any hassle. Polling went on smoothly in most booths. There were a few instances of EVMs developing snags leading to delays.

Over 23.95 lakh electors cast their vote in the city of which 1.4 lakhs were polled in T. Nagar.

The voter turnout for Saidapet, which includes parts of West Mambalam, was 57.26% (1.67 lakh votes).

Level in city reservoirs at 81% of total capacity

The combined storage in the city's reservoirs on April 9 was 9037 mcf, close to 81 % of their total capacity of 11,057 mcf. The storage on the same day last year was 6,257 mcf (around 56% of total capacity) Poondi had 1779 mcf as against its capacity of 3231 mcf (1260 mcf on the same day last year); Cholavaram had 752 mcf (total capacity 881 mcf, 72 mcf last year), Red Hills had 3060 mcf (total capacity 3300 mcf, 2860 mcf last year), Chembarampakam had 3007 mcf (total capacity 3645 mcf, 2065 mcf last year) and Kannankottai Thervoykandigai had 115 mcf (total capacity 479 mcf).

Even as the heat wave hit Chennai, the number of tanker lorries supplying water has not increased suggesting that there is no water scarcity as of now.

According to Metrowater data, the number of trips made by Metrowater tankers since March 15, when summer

No lockdown plans, Health Secy clarifies

Ahead of the polling on April 6, several WhatsApp forwards had been doing the rounds announcing 'lockdowns' and 'restrictions' to be imposed in the state.

This included implementing Section 144 of the CrPC across the state, closing down public spaces like beaches, asking private employees to work from home and closure of temples, multiplexes, cinemas, etc.

Denying that any such instructions for a lockdown had been given, Health Secretary J. Radhakrishnan urged the public on April 5 not to believe baseless rumours and create panic. While the government is likely to announce restrictions as the Health Department is tackling an increase in COVID-19 cases over the last month, officials have said that it would be a gradual process.

Chennai reported 1,344 positive cases and 14 deaths on April 5.

Corporation plans new curbs to control COVID-19

Over the past 10 days, the COVID-19 test positivity rate (TPR), which is a measure of the spread of the infection, has almost tripled in the city from 3.61% on March 23 to 9.13% on April 3.

TPR is the number of cases that return positive from among a 100 samples tested for COVID-19 virus infection. The Corporation has been testing 14,000 to 15,000 samples a day for the past few weeks across all its zones.

The number of active cases as on April 6 was 8,991 with the 2nd highest in Teynampet Zone (1011 cases) followed by Kodambakkam Zone (941 cases).

Commissioner G. Prakash said that the civic body is planning to impose stringent curbs on movement of people. He expressed confidence that once the new measures kick in, the case load will be

brought under control by April-end.

He said that three major points of action would be setting up more fever clinics in 100 top hotspot locations, bringing in 1,000 'focus volunteers' to ensure essentials reach those who are under home isolation to prevent them from venturing out and visits by fever survey workers to at least 250 houses a day.

3-phase power connection expensive

Sir, One of our members, who is a consumer under the single-phase LT category, recently applied for 3-phase connection.

He paid Rs. 22,000 under various heads such as Meter Caution Deposit, CC Deposit, SC Charges, Development Charges etc.

In 2014, the development charge was Rs. 1,400 per connection whereas it is now Rs. 2,500 per kilowatt. Therefore, for a 3-phase power connection with 5 kilowatt, the development charge amounts to Rs. 12,500 and a domestic consumer has to shell out a minimum of Rs. 22,000 for a three-phase connection.

One does not know the composition of development charges. While any marginal increase like in the case of Meter Caution Deposit or CC Deposit is understandable and acceptable, development charge of Rs. 2,500 per kilowatt is too high.

Considering that three-phase power is the need of the hour in every household as it ensures availability of power even when one or two of three phases go off, the development charges should be brought to affordable levels.

We appeal to TNEB to make 3-phase connection more affordable by bringing down the development charges. **T. Nagar Residents' Welfare Association, 30, Rangan Street, T. Nagar**

The only request the hospital made was that it should be informed in advance to avoid crowding. I am sure this is the situation in all hospitals/health centers authorized to administer the vaccine.

They set out on the bike but could not find the lorry till Irumbuliyur. They then decided to proceed towards Chengalpattu, as the lorry has a fixed speed limit of 55 kmph. As they suspected, they found the vehicle in Maraimalai Nagar.

"There were two persons in the truck, who had bought dinner and liquor on the way. One of them managed to escape from us, but we caught the other one and took him to Porur-SRMC police station," said Durai.

The accused was identified as S. Venugopal (55) of Tirupur.

Investigation revealed that he is involved in two-decade-old vehicle theft cases in the city.

Help birds beat the heat

With temperatures soaring and hitting the 41 degree centigrade mark, environmentalists and nature lovers are doing their bit to help birds and animals this summer. Here's how you can join the bandwagon

Keeping water in bowls:

The water bowl attracts birds of all sizes and species. This will help not only the birds but also creatures such as squirrels.

Residents should keep bowls filled with fresh water in open places with shade in their houses or flats such as terrace, balcony, garden or compound wall. The bowls should be refilled regularly.

You can also keep another bowl with millets or rice grains as they too attract birds.

This practice during summer will ensure that birds are not

forced to move away from their habitat in search of water elsewhere.

Statistics have proved that when large numbers of birds leave an area due to scarcity of water, the weaker birds usually die.

It is better to opt for a shallow earthen bowl so that even smaller birds and mammals can drink from it. Avoid plastic and steel bowls as the water may get heated in the sun.

It may take a couple of weeks for the birds to visit the bird bath. So be patient and keep refilling. It's best to leave the place undisturbed and observe for bird activity from a distance.

Clean the bowl periodically. If you are providing food, avoid cooked items like snacks and leftovers and only use raw grains.

Native trees are the best hosts for birds. They rest on their branches, feed on the insects and worms on the bark and rest under their shade.

On March 27, the animal activist group People For Cattle in India (PFCI) (Raghavaiah Road, T. Nagar, Ph: 98840 71136) kicked off its 'Water Bowl Challenge' by appealing to people to click and upload photos of animals/birds drinking out of bowls in their Facebook page to inspire participation.

G. Arun Prasanna (Member, PFCI) told *Mambalam Times* that every year, thousands of animals and birds die due to dehydration as they do not have access to clean drinking water. So PFCI has been distributing free cement water bowls since 2014.

"This year we want to give away 1,000 bowls. And we

want people to upload photos and tag a person to take up the challenge so that animals across the city get help. We have given about 50 so far and will soon start online registration. People can come to BCI and pick it up. We don't charge for the bowls but people can make a donation if they want," said Vinod Kumar of BCI.

PFCI has pick-up points in Kodambakkam, Anna Nagar, T. Nagar and Nungambakkam where people can get the bowls.

The Blue Cross of India (BCI) is also distributing water bowls.

Bhairava Animal Welfare Trust run by Nisha Singh and Prabha Venugopal is also giving out bowls free.

A message can be sent on their Facebook page to get the free bowl.

The ECI had asked voters to download the booth slip online. R. Subash, a resident of Anna Nagar, said: "I was not aware that I could download the booth slip. Normally, the election staff deliver booth slips to our homes. Many of us did not receive them this time. There was a lot of confusion in our polling station."

Actor couple sentenced for financial fraud

A special court in Chennai for MPs and MLAs ordered one year imprisonment for actor Radikaa Sarathkumar, her husband actor Sarath Kumar and their business partner Listin Stephen on April 7.

The court convicted the three and also imposed a fine of Rs. 3.30 crores.

Following a petition from Sarath Kumar and Listin seeking to suspend the order since they were going to appeal their case in the High Court, the court granted interim relief on the imprisonment order for 30 days.

The order came on a case of cheque fraud filed against Magic Frames, a partnership firm in T. Nagar in which Radikaa, Sarath Kumar and Listin are partners. The petition was filed by Radiance Media, a film financing company that had lent Rs 1.5 crores to Magic Frames in 2014.

Additionally, Sarath Kumar had borrowed Rs. 50 lakhs as hand loan from Radiance Media. At the time, it was said that the amount would be spent in the making of the film titled Idhu Enna Maayam in 2015.

While the borrowed amount had to be returned by March 2015, Radiance Media alleged that the seven cheques that were issued by Magic Frames bounced and, consequently, seven cases were filed. Their properties in T. Nagar too were pledged for this loan.

After repeated requests, Radiance Media filed a petition with the fast track court in Saidapet.

Owner poses as passenger, nabs auto thief

COVID-19 surge leads to higher demand for 108 ambulances

With hospitals being crowded with COVID-19 cases, the transportation of patients and inter-facility transfers have seen more than 50% surge in the last one month alone. While close to 40% queries are related to the virus, a large number of calls were made for inter-facility transfers of patients.

"There are nearly 800-1,000 COVID calls on a daily basis across all shifts. Most require transfer from home to hospital or private hospitals to government hospitals," said an executive in the 108 service provider.

Officials said that they are seeing a shift of choice of hospital among patients

contacting the helpline with more patients preferring government facilities over private healthcare. He added that discharges are quicker than in the past and inter-facility transfers are being sought.
