Lockdown extended till July 5 with further relaxations

On June 25, Tamilnadu government extended the lockdown by another week ending at 6 p.m. on July 5 with the following relaxations:

- Shopping malls and places of worship will be allowed to open from Monday, June 28.
- Textile shops and jewellery stores can function between 9 am and 7 pm without air-conditioning and with only 50% of customers at a time.
- All private establishments can function with 100% workforce.
- Only takeaway services will be allowed in restaurants, including those in shopping malls
- Theatres and game centres in commercial malls will not be permitted.
- Sports academies and outdoor events will be allowed between 6 a.m. and 9 p.m. but without spectators.
- Beaches will be open to the public from 5 a.m. to 9 a.m.

No time restrictions for women in suburban trains

Women can travel in suburban trains without any time restrictions. Women can also purchase return tickets for their travel while men working in non-essential services will be allowed travel only during non-peak hours from 7.30 a.m to 9.30 a.m and from 4.30 p.m to 7.30 p.m. Passengers with reserved tickets in mail/express trains will be allowed to travel in suburban trains to reach railway stations to board long distance trains. People who reach the city by mail/express trains will also be allowed to board suburban trains.

People who work in state or Union government departments, public sector undertakings, courts, and the private sector will be allowed to travel for duty with a permission letter from the higher officials and an identity card.

A fine of Rs. 500 will be imposed upon anyone seen in railway stations or in trains without a face mask.

Key member of ATM theft gang held in Haryana

All the cases related to SBI ATM theft incidents in Tamilnadu have been transferred to the State's elite investigation wing CB-CID for detailed probe.

Police said that one person of the 4-member gang involved in the thefts has been arrested in Haryana.

It is said that T. Nagar Deputy Commissioner Harikiran Prasad has left for Delhi to bring the arrested accused to Chennai for investigation.

Police are on the hunt for the rest of the gang.

Meanwhile, similar ATM thefts continue to be reported in the city.

Police said that Rs. 70,000 was lifted from the SBI ATM on North Usman Road in T Nagar.

Similarly, Rs. 16 lakhs was stolen using an ATM card 190 times in Periamedu, it was alleged.

The issue came to the lime-light after police started receiving complaints of money missing from ATM kiosks.

During investigation it was found that a gang of four exploited a technical flaw in several ATMs across Tamilnadu and swindled around Rs. 48 lakhs.

SBI's Chennai regional General Manager Radhakrishnan met city police Commissioner Shankar Jiwal and submitted a complaint.

Radhakrishnan said that the thefts took place only through one type of cash deposit machine and, as a precaution, SBI suspended withdrawals across India using both ATMs and deposit machines.



Woman held for murdering husband, paramour absconding

Saidapet police arrested Nirosha (30) on the charge of murdering her husband Kothandapani (36) with the help of her paramour Mani (26) at around 2 a.m on June 20.

Police have launched a search for Mani who is absconding.

According to the police, Kothandapani was an interior decorator and a resident of Jayaram Street (Saidapet).

He quarreled frequently with his wife over her illicit relationship and this led to the murder.

His wife was employed in a beauty parlour in T. Nagar and Mani worked in a tailoring shop near the parlour.

On the fateful night, Mani hacked the victim to death when he was asleep in his house.

Petrol price hiked again

Petrol price in the city neared Rs. 99 a liter on June 24 after fuel prices were increased again.

The price of petrol is now Rs 98.88 per liter (hiked by 26 paise per liter) and that of diesel Rs. 92.89 per liter (hike by 27 paise a liter).

Among metro cities, petrol is already above Rs. 100 in Mumbai, Hyderabad and Bengaluru.

The hike on June 24 is the 29th increase in prices since May 4.

Two held in land scam

Ashish Mehta (40) (resident of Ashok Nagar) and K. Selvam (45) (resident of Sriperumbudur) were arrested on June 23 in connection with Chennai-Bengaluru national highway land acquisition scam.

They availed of government compensation of Rs. 33 crores by using fake documents.

G. Radhakrishnan (Ex-Tahsildar) and Assistant Settlement Officer (ASO) Shanmugham have also been booked for cheating, forgery and criminal conspiracy in connection with the land scam unearthed by Pankaj Kumar Bansal (Tamilnadu Commissioner of Land Administration)(CLA).

CLA documents suggest that the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) acquired 2.5 acres of land from Ashish in Beemanthangal near Sriperumbudur in Kancheepuram district for expanding NH-4 and paid Rs. 33 crores as compensation.

During the settlement, NHAI was unaware that the land was originally classified as government anadeenam land.

Ashish Mehta, with the help of Radhakrishnan and Shanmugam, used fake documents for preparing pattas.

Metrowater launches drive to clean sewer lines

Metrowater launched a massive sewer cleaning program across 801 streets in the city on June 21 involving 258 de-silting machines, 142 jet rodding devices and 54 super suckers.

The Corporation plans to complete the cleaning in 10 days.

Metrowater had identified 128 streets in Teynempet Zone covering parts of T. Nagar along which sewer lines regularly overflow and will carry out measures to ensure it is rectified.

Similarly, such streets have been identified in all the other 14 zones also.

Geriatric Care Hospital provides Covid care for elderly



Geriatric Care Hospital (8, Dr. Nair Road, Parthasarathi Puram, T. Nagar), India's first geriatric multi-specialty hospital exclusively for senior citizens, has extended special care for over 500 patients with Covid, of which 200 were more than 70 years old. The elderly are more vulnerable to viruses like Covid, given the likelihood of comorbid conditions and various age related issues they may have.

Dr. Lakshmi Ramesh (Founder and Director of Gericare) said, "The concept of geriatric care is even more relevant in the context of the current Covid pandemic. The stringent isolation, for instance, can cause irreversible psychological trauma and in turn affect their physical well-being and recovery. Treating the elderly requires a holistic approach, including mental health support, psychological comfort and wholesome nutrition among other aspects. Simple interventions like video calls with family, doctor-attendant interactions and a positive environment of care and attention helped us achieve a high recovery rate."

Dr. Sreedevi (Geriatric Pulmonologist in Geri Care) said, "With optimal and appropriate use of drugs like steroids, we were able to achieve zero recorded cases of black fungus, a disease that has largely been fatal for older Covid patients across the country. All Covid patients treated in Geri Care underwent physiotherapy and breathing exercises as part of their recovery process during their stay in the hospital. This helped improve their mobility instead of being bed-ridden and also helped improve much needed lung capacity. Govt hospitals to up paediatric care to combat Covid

Health Minister Ma. Subramanian announced on June 19 that the state is working towards strengthening the infrastructure in its paediatric wards as a preparedness measure to counter a possible third wave of Covid.

This announcement comes at a time when the state is in the middle of controlling its second wave. He said Covid treatment wards for children are being set up in all hospitals.

In ESI Government Hospital (K. K. Nagar) 75 beds have been set aside for children and 250 beds in Children's Hospital (Egmore). All Urban Primary Health Care Centres are being upgraded with beds and oxygen support for children.

As on June 19, 87,336 children under 12 years of age have been infected by Covid in Tamilnadu which is 3% of the total cases of 24,50,000.

Mass cleaning drives by Corporation

Mass cleaning drives across the city to rid streets, corners and water bodies of garbage and debris have been started by Chennai Corporation. In just one location in West Mambalam, 12 tonnes of debris and 6 tonnes of garbage were removed from the Slum Clearance Board colony on June 21.

Totally, Corporation removed 190 tonnes of garbage and 790 tonnes of debris from around 100 locations across the city using 1400 workers and 360 machines like compactors, lorries, amphibians and robotic excavators on June 21.

Each of the 15 zones has been given a target of removing a particular quantity of waste and debris.

SBI halts ATM cash withdrawal

Indian's largest bank, the State Bank of India (SBI), has halted functioning of its ATMs across Tamilnadu, after two persons exploited technical flaws and looted at least Rs 48 lakhs.

Earlier this week, the bank put out posters at ATM centres with the message that cash withdrawal facility has been temporarily disabled in cash deposit machines (CDM) due to some technical error and customers can withdraw cash from ATM machines

Subsequently, cash withdrawal from ATM machines was also stopped for security reasons.

Banyan helps homeless women get ration/Aadhaar cards

The Banyan (6th Main Road, Eri Scheme, Mogappair) is a NGO that provides mental health services in institutional as well as community settings for women coming from distressed situations such as homelessness and poverty.

Last month, the NGO arranged for three ration cards among 12 of its inmates with members of their chosen 'sisters' formally listed as family members.

One family head was chosen from the three groups of four each and the ration card was issued in her name; each card listing four others.

The designated family heads among the 12 women had received their Aadhaar and voter IDs a couple of years back.



Kariyappan (Lead Program Manager in Banyan) said that the process is not easy. Most of the destitutes rescued and under the care of the NGO have no documentation at all. Many are found to have mental illnesses, and the organisation facilitates their treatment in a hospital setup before giving them a choice to move to a community setup in its reintegration programs.

He said that the process involves first obtaining 'Resident Certificate' from the Village Assistant Officer (VOA) for which a psychiatrist has to attest that the beneficiary is a resident of The Banyan and undergoing treatment. Beyond that it a long process of finally getting the ID cards, he said. The NGO has also been helping other organisations to obtain IDs for the destitute

under their care. It is in the process of obtaining ID cards for 45 inmates of a destitute home in Trichy.

"Our approach not only makes reintegration possible, but also ensures that destitutes can thrive with the right support and become self-reliant," Kariyappan said.

Citing the case of Srividya, who was rescued in 2014, he said that she now works as an Assistant Librarian in the Banyan.

She is one of the 12 beneficiaries who received the ration card, he added.

Low footfall in metro trains

Even as Chennai Metro resumed services on June 21, it registered less than 30% of its pre-Covid footfall.

Chennai Metro officials said that 29,091 persons travelled on June 21 and around 33,314 the next day. The majority of the passengers comprise people returning to work from office after the relaxation of lockdown.

Metro trains were catering to an average 1.16 lakh persons daily before the pandemic hit. Following the relaxation of the 1st lockdown in September 2020, it took more than 4 months for Chennai Metro to reach 80% of its normal running capacity. It is strictly implementing the SOPs mandated by the government.

Passengers without masks are not allowed and Rs. 200 fine is collected from those who remove them during journey. Staff stationed on platforms ensure that passengers maintain social distancing, an official said.

Suburban train services increased

Active cases fall below 4,000

With the test positivity rate (TOR) falling under 2 percent, the number of active cases in Chennai has come down below 4,000. As on June 23, the number of active cases in the city was 3,642 as per data released by the State Health Department.

This is just 0.63 percent of the 5,28,768 positive cases reported in the city from March 7, 2020.

372 new cases and 15 deaths were reported on June 24.

Teynampet and Kodambakkam Zones have 213 and 200 cases. Six zones have less than 200 active cases, and Manali, with 109 cases, being the lowest.

The test positivity rate has seen a major drop from 27.7 percent on May 11 to 1.91 percent on June 23.

Containment areas (streets with 10 or more cases) have dropped to 7 of which three are in Kodambakkam Zone and one in Teynampet Zone. There are 63 streets with more than six cases, including 12 in Teynampet Zone.

Against the backdrop of further relaxations in the lockdown from June 21, Corporation officials said that they have increased vigil to act against commercial establishments and citizens violating lockdown regulations. On June 23, 161 shops were penalised for violation of standard operating procedures, and 856 individuals were fined.

Zonal enforcement teams have started visiting wedding halls to ensure that norms are properly followed to avoid emergence of new clusters.

Commercial space in metro stations to be rented out

Following the resumption of metro services on June 21, Chennai Metro has invited tenders for renting out commercial spaces (bare shell shops and office spaces) in its stations in Corridors 1 and 2. The spaces will be rented at street, concourse and link bridge levels in select elevated and underground metro stations.

The move aims to facilitate the needs of commuters and increase footfall and boost the revenue for Chennai Metro.

The built-up space, ranging from 20 square meters (sqm) to 2000 sqm will be available for rent in select metro stations for 10 years.

The rental rate will be calculated at Rs. 310 to Rs. 775 per sqm. For more details, visit the website <https://chennaiemr.orail.org/>

He said that they crowd at shops and are not bothered about social distancing norms.

If this trend continues, Covid cases will again increase forcing the government to take drastic measures.

Sujith Chandran (Microbiologist) stated that though a 3rd wave might be inevitable, public should take care not to accelerate it by flouting norms.

Vaccination and self awareness are the two most important keys to defeat Covid, Sujith added.

Even though fines up to Rs. 300 are being levied on people for not wearing masks or not maintaining social distancing, they do not seem to bother.

Koyambedu is a classic example where Covid norms are flouted by both the traders and customers, keeping the police and health officials on their toes.

MTC resumes services

After 43 days, Metropolitan Transport Corporation (MTC) resumed its services from June 21 allowing 50% occupancy as mandated by the government.

It benefited a number of officegoers who do not own vehicles, and were hitherto forced to shell out high auto fares.

On day one, 1800 buses were operated.

This included 925 ordinary-fare buses in which women, transgenders and disabled people travelled free for the first time.

Specially-printed tickets are issued to these passengers.

85% of the MTC workforce has been vaccinated and around 2,800 buses were disinfected and made ready for operation,

"Hiring autos and travelling in buses without having to apply for e-registrations comes as a relief and it makes the commute to office easier," said Anandan, who works in a private firm in T. Nagar.

"I reside in Ashok Nagar and work in a factory in Ambattur. As traveling by auto was not affordable, I cycled daily which was very tiring. The resumption of bus service has come as a great relief to me," Ranjan said.

Pipeline work to supply water from Chembarambakkam lake to resume

The long-pending work to lay the pipeline to distribute water from the Chembarambakkam water treatment plant is expected to be completed by August 2022.

The project, which was started in 2013, was cancelled in March 2019 owing to a delay in the project.

Fresh tenders have been called to carry out the project in the remaining distance of nearly 1.7 km.

At present, nearly 265 mld of water is being supplied to the south and central parts of the city from the Chembarambakkam plant.

Once the project is completed, an additional quantity of 265 mld will be supplied to the central and southern parts of the city and southern suburbs including T. Nagar, West Mambalam and Saidapet.

Chennai metro resumes services

Following relaxation of the lockdown norms, Chennai Metro resumed services with 50% occupancy on June 21.

The trains ply from 6.30 a.m and 9 p.m.

The Blue Line services (between Airport Metro Station and Wimco Nagar Metro Station) and the Green Line services (between St Thomas Mount and Puratchi Thalaivar Dr MG Ramachandran Central Metro) has become operational.

Trains run with at 5-minute intervals during peak hours (6.30 a.m to 9 a.m and 5 p.m to 7 p.m. During the non-peak hours, the interval between trains is 10 minutes.

The following safety protocols have been issued for running metro trains in the city.

- All trains and metro stations should be disinfected frequently for the safety and security of passengers.

- Crowd Control/Platform Management staff should be deployed at stations to ensure physical distancing and safe de-boarding/boarding of passengers at all times.

- Passengers should wear facemasks, maintain a safe distance of 6 feet while waiting on the platform and travelling on the train.

25000+ vaccinated daily in the city

More than 25,000 persons are being administered Covid vaccine daily in the city since June 7.

On June 23, 30,108 persons were administered the vaccine as per Chennai Corporation data while 28,345 persons were vaccinated on June 24.

According to a Corporation official, temporary vaccination centers (mostly in community halls and Corporation schools) that offer enough space to ensure social distancing norms are maintained have been opened in all the 15 zones.

He said that due to lack of steady supply, they are not able to rope in private companies and industries to carry out vaccination of employees in their premises.

He said that many resident associations and gated communities have also come forward to organise vaccination drives for their residents.

More than 28 lakh persons have already been vaccinated in the city.

Of this, around 6.85 lakh have taken both doses.

"Teynampet and Anna Nagar Zones, which reported the highest number of active cases, continue to register the highest vaccination numbers," said the official.

According to Dr. Kalai (Stanley Hospital), the impact of the second wave has reduced the hesitancy of people to get vaccinated.
