ED acts against Saravana Stores Gold Palace

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached the properties worth Rs. 234.75 crores of Saravana Stores (Gold Palace, T. Nagar) in a money laundering case filed for defrauding Indian Bank. The ED initiated an investigation under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002, based on an FIR (April 25, 2022) registered by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Economic Offences Wing, Chennai. The ED recorded the case in May 2022 under the PMLA.

According to details provided by the ED, it is alleged that late Pallakudurai, P. Sujatha and Y.P. Shiravan, partners of Saravana Stores (Gold Palace), with the criminal intention of cheating Indian Bank (T. Nagar branch), had conspired with unknown public servants and others. Investigation revealed that Saravana Stores (Gold Palace) had applied for a loan and fabricated its balancesheet and projected that the company was financially healthy. Details provided by the ED highlighted that there was a huge mismatch between the sales reported by the firm and the credit entries. Turnover projections were not provided accurately when the loan was taken.

The firm, in collusion with the property valuer, a few bank officials and some private persons, proposed to purchase assets at a price which was higher than the market value.

The investigation revealed that the accused persons overstated the inventory, transferred the assets without the knowledge of the bank, used the OCC limits to repay the term loan, misappropriated and diverted the funds and committed other irregularities.

Thus, the accused persons and the firm cheated the bank and caused it a wrongful loss. "The accused company has generated proceeds of crime amounting to Rs, 240 crores out of criminal activities," the ED said in a statement.



Tree pruning near drains intensified

According to Chennai Corporation data, 746 trees, which are close to stormwater drains, have been identified to be pruned on 118 roads where stormwater drain works are being carried out.

Of these trees, 408 trees have been pruned to prevent mishaps.

Following the KK Nagar incident in which a tree close to an under-construction stormwater drain fell on a moving car killing a woman, Chennai Corporation has pruned more than 400 trees near the drains.

Meanwhile, the civic body pruned 1,206 trees on the roads that are in weak condition.

Time limit for property tax queries lapses before getting notices

Chennai Corporation has been serving the property tax revision notices to property owners and asking them to pay the taxes on revised rates, but some owners said that the 15-day time limit to send objections had already lapsed before they received the notices through post. A property owner in T. Nagar said that he had received the revision notice on July 2 but the notice has been dated June 15.

"Even before receiving the notice, the time limit for objections has lapsed. Several property owners also experienced similar issues," he added.

When asked, a Chennai Corporation official attached to the revenue wing said that the delay occurs due to the various processes involved in sending the notices.

"However, the property owners can still send their objections and doubts to the civic body as the 15-day time limit would only commence based on the dispatch date registered in the postal department," he explained. He further added that dispatch dates are being registered using the barcode on the envelope and the postal department shares the details periodically. "We will entertain all the objections and clear doubts," he added.

The civic body had already sent more than 5 lakh property revision notices to the residents up to June 27. In total, there are more than 13 lakh property tax assessments in the city and notices will be sent to all the owners.

Meanwhile, the civic body has requested owners to pay their taxes as per the revised rates using QR codes printed on the notices. Also, owners can pay their taxes by handing over cheques, demand drafts and others to the tax collectors or visit www.chennaicorporation.gov.in to pay their taxes without transaction charges. Property owners, who had paid taxes at old rates, should pay the balance amount.

80% source segregation in Kodambakkam

As Chennai Corporation begins awareness sessions ahead of implementing the fine for non-segregation of waste at the domestic level, three zones including Kodambakkam have achieved around 80% source segregation.

"In other zones, the source segregation is about 60-70% and we are pushing for more," a senior Corporation official said.

In May, the Corporation had said that a fine of Rs 100 will be levied for failing to segregate domestic waste as per the Solid Waste Management Bylaws.

At present, conservancy workers who are collecting waste door-to-door broadly categorise unsegregated waste handed over to them before dumping them into marked bins in their battery operated vehicles.

Artificially ripened fruits seized

Food Safety officials on July 6 seized 7 tonnes of mangoes and 500 kgs of bananas in West Mambalam and Koyambeduthat had been ripened with chemicals.

On a tip-off, a five-member team inspected 25 shops and found six shops using the chemical, Ethephon, in sachets to ripen the fruits.

P. Sathesh Kumar (Officer, Food Safety Department) said Ethephon should not be used directly on the fruits for ripening, and such fruits were unsafe for consumption.

"We have imposed a fine of Rs. 5,000 and warned the owners that the shops will be sealed permanently if they continue to commit such offences," he said.

The seized fruits were destroyed.

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9-year-old, plants 48,000 saplings and counting

"Just as a tiny seed can grow into a 400-ft tall tree, I feel age does not matter. We all have the potential to bring about positive changes," Prasiddhi Singh, a 9-year-old environmentalist who has planted around 48,000 trees through her foundation, Prasiddhi Forest Foundation, said. "I established the foundation when I was 6 to connect me with nature and help me find my purpose and responsibility towards Mother Earth. The incident which triggered me the most was the Vardah cyclone in 2016. The havoc caused by the cyclone was heartbreaking. I saw birds, monkeys, and squirrels hunting for shelter as their natural habitat had been uprooted. That is when I decided to plant trees," she said.



Prasiddhi, who won the Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Shakti Puraskar in 2021 for her contribution to nature and the environment, said that winning the award helped her raise awareness among her peers, neighbourhood, and society about the importance of nurturing the environment and climate change.

She has been recognised for her work by several organisations and proceeds of the prize money she has received has been spent on planting more trees and erecting fences around saplings.

"My immediate goal is to plant one lakh trees by 2022. I have already planted 48,000 plants in several schools, colleges, government offices, on corporate land, village land, farms and in community gardens, and other safe public places. I dream of creating a happy, healthy, and equitable planet for all living beings," Prasiddhi said.

Library of dreams

Among the many dreams Vasanthan, an Arts student in Madras Christian College, had was starting a library in his father's village in Tiruchirappalli. But fate did not give him a chance to make it happen. The young man met with a fatal accident.

However, Vasanthan's parents Sudha and M. Ulaga Oli, who are avid readers, would not let their boy's dream fade away.

They found it difficult to set up a library in Tiruchirappalli, but did the next best thing.

In 2015, one year after his death, they established the Vasanthan Library in their home in 38/2, Sivan Koil Street, Ganga Nagar, Kodambakkam, to honour his memory.

The library today helps hundreds of young people in their academic pursuits and to determine a career path too.

"Looking back at these seven years, as parents we feel happy and proud. Vasanthan Library is not just a library. It is a center where children, youngsters, and even some old people come and enjoy books, share their emotions and personal life with others, and leave de-stressed," says Sudha, who was a banker and Tamil news reader.

"When we started, it was just the books from Vasanthan's and his dad's collection. Later, with our friends' help and donations we procured more books. At one time we had over 5000 books," said Sudha, adding, "we support new independent libraries started by individuals or associations, and sometimes donate books from our collection to them. So, our inventory now stands at around 3000," she said.

Sudha and Ulaga Oli also started organising community activities such as drawing competitions, talk shows and interactive sessions by subject experts for kids children on Saturdays and on occasions too.

Sudha provides career guidance and helps youngsters find jobs suited to their qualifications. Those preparing for Civil Service exams initially made use of Vasanthan's books as he was also preparing for the competitive examination.

"Since those books are outdated, each year we acquire new books," said Sudha.

Though the library does not lend books, reference books are always in high demand and the collection in Vasanthan Library helps it stand out. The family sold its car and turned the parking area into a reading room. With the spacious hall and the parking space they can accommodate 10 to 15 readers at a time.

After the impact of lockdown, digitally recorded books for children are a new project Vasanthan Library has embarked on in its YouTube channel.

"We have been getting help from volunteers, especially teachers, to read and record the books, and we now need volunteers who can edit and produce videos to go with the audio clips. We have recordings of academic books for students till Class X," Sudha said.

Pasumai Vasantham is another project - they present seeds and saplings to schools and individuals. An online school is also being explored.

1st tunnel boring machine for Metro project arrives

The first tunnel boring machine (TBM) has arrived from China and will be used to build the underground stretch between Madhavaram and Kellys for Chennai Metro phase-2 project.

According to the officials, 23 more such TBMs will be needed for the phase-2 project.

The process of assembling and moving it to the location



will take around three months while tunnelling is expected to start in October.

The 118.9 km phase II project is being built at a cost of Rs 61,843 crores.

It has three corridors, Madhavaram to SIPCOT via Kellys (corridor 3), Madhavaram to Sholinganallur (corridor 5) via Medavakkam and Light House to Poona-mallee via T. Nagar (corridor 4).

Rains bring down air pollution levels

Though more vehicles are moving on the road, the recent rains have brought down pollution levels in the city.

According to Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) data, the air quality levels in the city were within the permissible limits.

On July 5, the PM 2.5 level in Velachery was 37 microgram / m³, Arumbakkam 41 microgram / m³, Kodugaiyur 47 microgram / m³, Perungudi 48 microgram / m³ and Alandur 58 microgram / m³.

On June 28, North Chennai recorded the highest of which Manali had 179 microgram / m³, followed by Royapuram with 80 microgram / m³.

While the levels in other areas were within the permissible limit with Velachery recording 57 microgram / m³, Kodugaiyur and Perungudi 62 and 61 microgram / m³ respectively.

A Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) official said, "The air quality level in the city, which is within the permissible limits, is good. North Chennai has a satisfactory level of pollution level though there is continuous movement of container lorries the whole day."

Contractors fined for slow progress of storm water drains work

Tax on buildings with cellphone towers

Even as Chennai Corporation commenced issuing property tax revision notices to owners, the civic body plans to earn additional revenue by taxing mobile phone towers on private buildings. Vishu Mahajan (Chennai Corporation Deputy Commissioner, Revenue and Finance) said that field officials have so far identified around 3,000 cell phone towers across the city. "Property tax will be calculated based on the rental amount being collected by property owners from the telecom firms. There is a formula to arrive at the tax amount and we have asked the telecom firms to provide details of the towers," he added.

Several years back, the civic body collected property tax for cellphone towers but some property owners approached the courts against the tax calculation methods.

Mahajan added that half yearly tax amount for the cellphone towers was fixed at Rs 15,000 flat for all the buildings irrespective of the rent that the owners earn. While delivering the order in the cases against the property tax, the High Court instructed collection of the tax based on the rent.

A senior official said that measures have been taken to deliver the tax demand notices to the 3,000 property owners.

Corporation tightens Covid curbs

Among the 15 zones, Kodambakkam and Tondiarpet accounted for most of the mask violations, with 19 persons fined in each zone. Chennai Corporation on July 5 fined 121 persons for not wearing masks and collected Rs 60,500 during enforcement of Covid protocols. On July 4, it had announced compulsory wearing of masks in the wake of a surge in Covid cases.

Corporation officials are monitoring places like markets, commercial buildings, malls, theaters, marriage halls, government and private offices and hospitals. Metropolitan Transport Corporation drivers and conductors were directed to wear masks inside buses and ensure that passengers also did so.

Chennai Metro also announced that wearing masks inside the station and trains is mandatory.

Bill alert via sms for consumers with smart meters

As Tangedco has dispensed with manual reading of meters in T. Nagar with the installation of smart meters, a section of electricity consumers has complained about not receiving any alerts about the payment of electricity bills.

The residents, particularly senior citizens, who have not registered their mobile numbers linking them to electricity meters do not get payment alerts. The problem becomes serious with the consumers facing disconnection due to non-payment of power bills.

V. Jayaraman, an office-bearer of the T. Nagar Residents' Welfare Association, said ever since the smart meters were installed in the locality, the recording of the electricity consumption through the assessors has been dispensed with.

While most consumers who have registered their mobile numbers have been getting payment alerts through short message service (SMS) and also email, those who have not linked their mobile numbers are in the dark about the due payment of electricity bills and in danger of their power connections being cut, he added.

The residents point out that Tangedco could have taken steps to update the consumer details through the assessors before discontinuing the old system. A senior official of Tangedco said all the consumers in T. Nagar, who have got smart meters, have been duly mapped with mobile numbers provided and those who have not registered their mobile numbers can register using any of their last paid receipts (any one receipt of last three payment cycles).

Tangedco had installed smart meters for 1.25 lakh power connections under the Smart City Mission project covering the entire T. Nagar area and parts of Kodambakkam in Rangarajapuram.

Metro girders installation for phase-2 begins

The stretch between Porur and Poonamallee covering 8km may be the first route where driverless trains will commence operations in metro rail's phase-2 as the installation of girders on the pillars in the centre of the road has begun.

Officials said the concrete pre-cast girders on which ballastless tracks will be laid have been placed for nearly a kilometre distance along the suburban route.

Porur-Poonamallee is part of corridor-4 from Lighthouse to Poonamallee bypass which is expected to be ready by 2025.

In a release, Chennai Metro said the first tunnel boring machine (TBM) has arrived in the city and tunnelling may commence at Madhavaram Milk Colony in October.

The deadline for phase-2 is 2025-2026. Metro rail officials said 111 pillars have been constructed along the Porur-



Poonamallee stretch and another 342 pillars will be built for the elevated corridor on the route.

Officials said unlike small segmental girders used in phase-1, those used in phase-2 are around 25m-28m long spanning the distance between two pillars. The long girders, though difficult to transport due to their length and weight, enable faster construction.

CMRL plans to get the line from Powerhouse in Kodambakkam to Poonamallee ready by June 2025 and the rest of the phase by December.

When corridor-4 opens, travelers from localities between Porur and Poonamallee can reach city areas like Marina Beach, Mylapore, Nandanam, T. Nagar, Kodambakkam and Vadapalani faster in a single train journey.

'No honking' campaign ends

Pensioners can get Life Certificate from postman

The Postal Department has been authorised to provide Digital Life Certificate to pensioners in their homes.

The Post Master of T. Nagar Post Office told *Mambalam Times* that pensioners in need of life certificate can contact the area postman or call the post office to avail of the service.

He said that the charge for the service is Rs. 70. The postman will carry the necessary App in his mobile phone to process the digital certificate.

The pensioner must provide the postman his/her Aadhar number, registered phone number, bank account number and pension payment order number, followed by the OTP received in his/her phone.

The digital life certificate will be directly sent by the postman to the Pension Pay Office with a link to the pensioner's phone to view/download the certificate.

Residents oppose housing workers in Somasundaram ground

T. Nagar residents have opposed the Corporation's move to set up labour sheds in Somasundaram ground (Parthasarathipuram, T. Nagar) as they hinder sporting activities and morning walks.

The ground, which approximately measures eight acres, was used as a parking lot for garbage vans last year and recruit drives subsequently.

After opposition, it was cleared early this year. But, once again a portion of it is now being used for non-sporting activities. Condemning this, T. Nagar resident-activist A B Muthukumar said, "Initially, we saw one workers' shed in one corner of the ground. But now, they are expanding it quickly and raising the ground level by filling it with rubble so that more structures can be set up.

"Already, we have lost the children's play area as they have used this space to dump construction material and other waste. And the workers damaged the basketball court, entrances and a portion of the compound wall in the process of erecting these sheds," said D. Kumaran, a T. Nagar resident, who regularly plays cricket on this ground.

When contacted, Corporation authorities said they were accommodating workers who were working on ongoing storm water drain project.

"It is clear that the Corporation is planning to accommodate at least 200 workers here and we fear that once the project is complete, it might be used to accommodate workers involved in other projects," Kumaran said. When asked about the issue, Deputy Commissioner D. Sneha said there were no such plans, and it was only a temporary arrangement for workers who come from the city's outskirts.

Her subordinates assured residents that the sheds will be dismantled once the storm water drain work is completed in September or before the onset of the monsoon. The living conditions inside these sheds are poor as there are no drinking water or toilet facilities. As an ad hoc arrangement, all the workers use the mobile toilets installed behind the gym area.

Correction in property tax assessment by March 2023

Chennai Corporation hopes to complete the work of correcting property tax assessment by March next year.

Anna Nagar, Teynampet and Kodambakkam zones have the maximum number of properties with incorrect assessment, officials said. Owners of over two lakh properties, both residential and commercial, may get notices from Chennai Corporation about the incorrect assessment of property tax.

At least 40,000 properties in these zones have been underassessed.

Once these properties are assessed correctly, the Corporation is expected to get an additional revenue of Rs. 1,500 crores every year.

The city has more than 12 lakh properties, which include residential and commercial buildings. The initiative was taken following an agreement signed by the Corporation with the World Bank and AIIB (Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank) to improve its own sources of revenue.

Thaneer Pandhals go dry, become an eyesore

Defunct Thaneer Pandhals, kiosks containing water pots maintained by political parties during summer, have become an eyesore in many areas. With elections over, members of political parties that erected these kiosks have vanished and most of the makeshift structures have collapsed and pots broken.

They dot localities such as MGR Nagar, KK Nagar, Ashok Nagar and Kodambakkam. These temporary structures occupy public places and narrow carriageways and walkways, obstructing movement.

Many of them were erected without permission, as they claim to be for the benefit of the public. N. Vishwanathan of KK Nagar said, "Such places are also rented out to vendors for peddling their goods." He also complained that these structures are not removed even after the summer season concludes. The kiosks are rarely maintained and within days the pots are broken, left on the floor, and most often remain uncovered, with the water becoming unfit for drinking.

In many places, the pots are missing and the structures are abandoned. A Corporation official said the structures will be removed during the weekly encroachment removal drive.

Std. 9 student electrocuted at home

13-year-old Bharat of West Mambalam (Std. 9 student in a private school in Saidapet) was electrocuted when he switched on the TV while alone at home on July 5. His father Baskar (48) had left for work while his mother had gone to meet a relative.
