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Chain snatcher caught by public

Members of the public caught a man who snatched a gold chain from a bank staff in Triplicane in the morning on Aug. 10, and handed him over to the police after thrashing him. The victim, A. Monisha (20) (resident of Ashok Nagar), works in State Band of India (University of Madras branch).

On Aug. 10, when she was walking along Swami Sivananda Road towards her office, a man snatched her 3-sovereign chain and tried to escape.

On hearing her screams, members of the public chased the man and caught him. He was thrashed and handed him over to the police.

The accused was identified as P. Ramamurthy (40) of Triplicane.

தூக்கைப் பள்ளிக்கூடத்தில் ஓரிடத்தில் மாட்டிவிட்டுப் பிள்ளைகள் முறைப்படி இருந்து முதல் நாள் நடந்த பாடங்களைப் பாராமல் ஒப்பிக்க வேண்டும். அதற்கு முறை சொல்லுதல் என்று பெயர். அப்போது உபாத்தியாயர் வீட்டிற்குள் படுத்துக் கொண்டிருப்பார்; அவரை எதிர்பாராமல் பிள்ளைகள் பாடங்களை முறை சொல்ல வேண்டும். அதை அவர் உள்ளே இருந்தபடியே கவனிப்பார். பெரும்பாலும் திண்ணைப் பள்ளிக்கூடங்கள் உபாத்தியாயரது வீட்டுத் திண்ணையிலேயே இருக்கும்.

ஆறு மணிக்கு மேல் பிள்ளைகள் எல்லாம் வாய்க்கால் அல்லது குளம் முதலிய இடங்களுக்குப் போய்த் தந்த கத்தி செய்து தங்கள் தங்கள் குலத்திற்கேற்ற சின்னங்களைத் தரித்துக்கொண்டு ஸந்தியாவந்தனமோ வேறு அனுஷ்டானமோ செய்வார்கள். பிறகு தங்கள் வஸ்திரங்களில் மணலை எடுத்துக்கொண்டு மூஷிகவாகனம், சரஸ்வதி ஸ்தோத்திரம் முதலியவற்றை சொல்லிக் கொண்டே பள்ளிக்கூடத்திற்கு வருவார்கள். முன்பிருந்த பழைய மணலை அகற்றிவிட்டுப் புதிய மணலைப் பரப்புவார்கள். எழுதுவதற்குரியவர்கள் அதில் எழுதுவார்கள். மற்றவர்கள் தங்கள் பாடங்களைப் படிப்பார்கள்.

ஒன்பது மணிக்குப் பிள்ளைகளைப் பழையது (பழைய அழுது) சாப்பிட விடுவது வழக்கம். அப்பொழுது உபாத்தியாயர் ஒரு பக்கத்தில் வீற்றிருந்து ஒவ்வொரு பிள்ளையின் கையிலும் பிரம்பால் அடித்து அனுப்புவார். பழைய சோற்று ருசியில் பள்ளிக்கூட ஞாபகம் மறக்கக்கூடாது என்பதற்காக அங்ஙனம் செய்வார் போலும்!

பிள்ளைகளுக்குள்ளே கெட்டிக்காரனாகவும், பலசாலியாகவும் இருப்பவனை உபாத்தியாயர் சட்டாம் பிள்ளையாக நியமிப்பார். அவன் புத்திசாலியாக இராவிட்டாலும் பலசாலியாக இருக்க வேண்டியது அவசியம். உபாத்தியாயருக்குப் பிரதிநிதியாகப் பிள்ளைகளை அடக்கி ஆள்வதும், பாடம் ஒப்பிக்கக் கேட்பதும் அவன் வேலைகள். அவனிடம் எல்லோரும் அடங்கி நடக்க வேண்டும். சில பிள்ளைகள் அவனுக்கு வேண்டிய தின்பண்டங்களைக் கொடுத்துத் தம் வசப்படுத்தி உபாத்தியாயருடைய பிரியத்தையும் அவன் மூலமாக சம்பாதிப்பார்கள். சில சமயங்களில் உபாத்தியாயரது கடுமையைக் காட்டிலும் சட்டாம் பிள்ளையின் கடுமை அதிகமாக இருக்கும்.

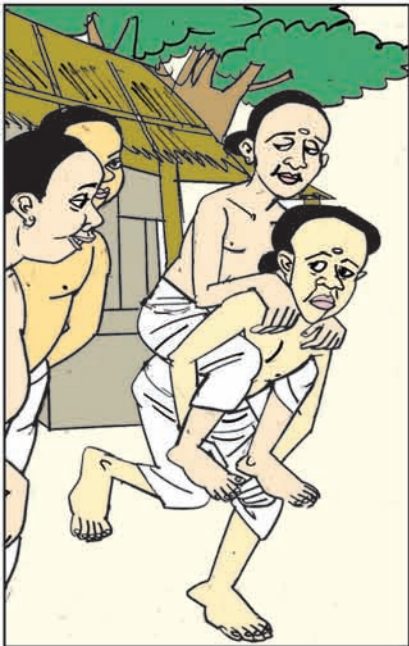

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80-year-old woman murdered in her house for jewellery

31-year-old Ammu, a domestic help, and two of her accomplices were arrested on Aug. 13 on charge of robbing 12 sovereigns of jewellery from 80-year-old Radha Krishna-murthy and murdering her in her apartment on Kuppasamy Street (T. Nagar) on Aug. 13. Pondy Bazaar police recovered the jewellery from them.



Radha was a social worker and President of Apoorva Women's Association.

She had been living alone the apartment on the second floor of the building.

Around 10 a.m, Ammu, who worked as Radha's domestic help, alerted a neighbour stating that there was no response to her repeated knocks on the door.

After the neighbour contacted her son living in Besant Nagar, the latter arrived within 30 minutes and opened the main door with a duplicate key to find his mother lying dead on the sofa with injuries on her face and neck. A pillow was found near the body. Based on his complaint, police sent the body to the ESIC Hospital (K.K. Nagar) for postmortem. The postmortem revealed that Radha had died between 4 p.m and 6 p.m due to asphyxiation.

The footage of the CCTV cameras installed outside the building showed two unidentified men entering the building and leaving within the suspected period.

Police questioned Ammu and found that she had conspired with the two men to murder Radha and steal her jewellery.

Radha was into social service for over 4 decades and through the Association, she had provided scholarships to scores of poor students and had conducted free job-oriented courses for women from underprivileged families. Her services had been highlighted several times in *Mambalam Times*.

At the stroke of the midnight hour, when the world sleeps, India will awake to life and freedom. A moment comes, which comes but rarely in history, when we step out from the old to the new, when an age ends, and when the soul of a nation, long suppressed, finds utterance. It is fitting that at this solemn moment, we take the pledge of dedication to the service of India and her people and to the still larger cause of humanity.

At the dawn of history, India started on her unending quest, and trackless centuries are filled with her striving and grandeur of her success and failures. Through good and ill fortune alike, she has never lost sight of that quest, forgotten the ideals which gave her strength.

We end today a period of misfortunes and India discovers herself again. That future is not one of ease or resting but of incessant striving so that we may fulfill the pledges we have so often taken and the one we shall take today. The service of India means, the service of the millions who suffer. It means the ending of poverty and ignorance and poverty and disease and inequality of opportunity. The ambition of the greatest men of our generation has been to wipe every tear from every eye. That may be beyond us, but as long as there are tears and suffering, so long our work will not be over.

And so we have to labour and to work, and to work hard, to give reality to our dreams. Those dreams are for India, but they are also for the world, for all the nations and peoples are too closely knit together today for any one of them to imagine that it can live apart. Peace is said to be indivisible, so is freedom, so is prosperity now, and also is disaster in this one world that can no longer be split into isolated fragments.

To the people of India, whose representatives we are, we make an appeal to join us with faith and confidence in this great adventure. This is not time for petty and destructive criticism, not time for ill-will or blaming others. We have to build the noble mansion of free India where all her children may dwell.

The appointed day has come - the day appointed by destiny - and India stands forth again, after long slumber and struggle, awake, vital, free and independent. The past clings on to us still in some measure and we have to do much before we redeem the pledges we have so often taken.

Yet the turning-point is past, and history begins anew for us, the history which we shall live and act and others will write about.

It is a fateful moment for us in India, for all Asia and for the world. A new star rises, the star of freedom in the East, a new hope comes into being, a vision long cherished materializes. May the star never set and that hope never be betrayed!

We rejoice in that freedom, even though clouds surround us, and many of our people are sorrow-stricken and difficult problems encompass us. But freedom brings responsibilities and burdens and we have to face them in the spirit of a free and disciplined people.

On this day our first thoughts go to the architect of this freedom, the Father of our Nation, who, embodying the old spirit of India, held aloft the torch of freedom and lighted up the darkness that surrounded us. We have often been unworthy followers of his and have strayed from his message, but not only we but succeeding generations will remember this message and bear the imprint in their hearts of this great son of India, magnificent in his faith and strength and courage and humility. We shall never allow that torch of freedom to be blown out, however high the wind or stormy the tempest.

Our next thoughts must be of the unknown volunteers and soldiers of freedom who, without praise or reward, have served India even unto death.

We think also of our brothers and sisters who have been cut off from us by political boundaries and who unhappily cannot share at present in the freedom that has come. They are of us and will remain of us whatever may happen, and we shall be sharers in their good [or] ill fortune alike.

The future beckons to us. Whither do we go and what shall be our endeavour? To bring freedom and opportunity to the common man, to the peasants and workers of India; to fight and end poverty and ignorance and disease; to build up a prosperous, democratic and progressive nation, and to create social, economic and political institutions which will ensure justice and fullness of life to every man and woman.

We have hard work ahead. There is no resting for any one of us till we redeem our pledge in full, till we make all the people of India what destiny intended them to be. We are citizens of a great country on the verge of bold advance, and we have to live up to that high standard. All of us, to whatever religion we may belong, are equally the children of India with equal rights, privileges and obligations. We cannot encourage communalism or narrow-mindedness, for no nation can be great whose people are narrow in thought or in action.

To the nations and peoples of the world we send greetings and pledge ourselves to cooperate with them in furthering peace, freedom and democracy.

And to India, our much-loved motherland, the ancient, the eternal and the ever-new, we pay our reverent homage and we bind ourselves afresh to her service.

The day I joined the typing school, the instructor led me to an old bare chested Underwood Champion typewriter.

It looked like an old sick man sitting on a hospital bed counting his ribs and days. Typewriters set aside by typing institutes for beginners were just like driving school cars - old and run-down. Typebars are supposed to rise from the well one at a time. In the case of my vintage typewriter, it was two or even three at a time. This resulted in typebars getting entangled with one another often. I had to disengage them like a referee who separates wrestlers in a boxing ring.

Even as I started the first lesson asdfgf;lkjhj my left middle finger got caught between keys of d and f. Hearing my 'ouch' the instructor came running to me. While extricating my finger he told me sarcastically, "You should type without not only looking at the keys but also at the girls" He was a biased bespectacled cobra. When it came to me "All your fingers are thumbs" he hissed but when it came to the girl sitting next to me "What nimble and long fingers you possess? Learn Veena you will be a great Veena Vidwan like Chittibabu" he drooled.

Whenever a comely girl joined our school a dozen boys crossed over to our school from rival ones. While there were many girls who made many heads of boys turn, there was a boy named Kannan who made the ears of many girls of our institute prick up when he walked in and started typing at hurricane speed.

"It is like standing under a rail bridge when an express train is hurtling overhead" A girl raved. 'He is typing like lightning' another extolled. He became a bigger hero when he won the Sarasvati Pooja annual typing race. It was as if he was a jockey and his typewriter was a horse. As expected, he finished typing his stuff in half the time allotted to contestants. As for me I was the last man typing. Kannan received a standing ovation from girls when he received the trophy. I learnt my first lesson in women psychology. Boys fall down for appearance and girls stand up for performance. As those days co-ed schools were rare, it was at typing institutes that boys got an opportunity to sit next to girls. Typewriting institutes were known those days as fertile breeding grounds for teenage romances most of which of course just withered off or got nipped in the bud.

The whole world might have forgotten typewriters but I have not. They helped me a lot when I was a budding writer.

Corporation puts property tax revision on hold

Following stiff and wide-spread public opposition to the unannounced revision of property tax assessments, Chennai Corporation has put the reassessment process on hold with immediate effect.

The steep surge in tax, and the manner in which it was imposed, drew widespread criticism on social media, with several residents posting details of the demand notice that were sent to them in the recent days.

A Corporation official said that using Geographic Information System (GIS) mapping, satellite data, official records, and the self-declaration drive, it had identified more than 3.5 lakh property owners who were paying under-assessed or incorrect amounts, including 1.5 lakh residential property owners who had self-declared discrepancies in property values.

After it triggered a strong owners, Corporation put the opposition from property reassessment on hold.

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
